## **ARRESTS MADE IN COLLEGE DRIVE HOMICIDES**

Update 06-10-2021

Today, Baton Rouge Police Detectives with the assistance of the U.S. Marshals Task Force arrested DAVID WILLIAMS, 19 of 6920 Ernest Morgan Road, St. Francisville, Louisiana, along with a 15-year-old juvenile in the Baton Rouge area. Investigators believe that the two are connected in the deaths of DEWAYNE DUNN, JR., REGINALD THOMAS and JA'TYRI BROWN that occurred on May 31, 2021.

Anonymous Crime Stoppers tips played a vital role in this investigation.

WILLIAMS will be booked in the East Baton Rouge Parish Prison on the charges of First Degree Murder (3cts) and Illegal Use of Weapons or Dangerous Instrumentalities.

The 15-year-old will be booked in the Juvenile Detention Center on the charges of First Degree Murder (3cts) and Illegal Use of Weapons or Dangerous Instrumentalities.

This investigation remains ongoing.

Baton Rouge Police Detectives are investigating a shooting that occurred last night around 7:55 p.m. at 2245 College Drive.

Investigators believe that an unknown male subject(s) entered the gated pool area where several people were gathered. The unknown subject(s) approached two male

individuals who were seated near the pool. A short struggle occurred prior to the suspect(s) firing several gunshots striking the two individuals. An infant child who was playing near the pool was also struck by the gunfire.

DEWAYNE DUNN, JR., 17 of 955 Whitehead Street, Baker, Louisiana, along with REGINALD THOMAS, 20 of 4310 Ashland Street, Baker, Louisiana, succumbed to their injuries at the scene.

The infant child, JA'TYRI BROWN, 1 of 2225 College Drive, succumbed to her injuries at a local hospital.

This investigation remains ongoing.
