UPDATE-SHOOTING ON HARDING BLVD

Update – 10/23/2022

Baton Rouge Police Detectives arrested JAICEDRIC WILLIAMS, 22, for his involvement in the shooting that occurred during the early morning hours on October 21, 2022 at 636 Harding Blvd. Williams was apprehended by U.S. Marshal's at his home without incident around 1:00pm today.

Williams is being booked into East Baton Rouge Parish Prison for 11 counts of Attempt 1st Degree Murder and Illegal Use of a Weapon.

This is an ongoing investigation.

Original – 10/21/2022

Early this morning around 1:50 AM, Baton Rouge Police officers responded to 636 Harding Boulevard regarding a reported shooting.

Based on all the information available, investigators believe this event was an isolated incident. Investigators do not believe there is any ongoing related threat to the campus of Southern University.

At the scene this morning, BRPD officers were able to assist those with injuries and detectives were able to conduct an initial investigation.

Original reports indicated that nine (9) individuals sustained apparent non-life-threatening gunshot wounds. However, with two additional individuals coming forward, the number of victims is now eleven (11).

Throughout the day, detectives have continued their investigative measures by interviewing potential witnesses, processing evidence, canvassing the area, and working to identify any individual(s) involved.

Through the joint effort of BRPD officers and the U. S. Marshall Task Force, two of the alleged perpetrators were located and taken into custody, beginning early this morning. Each was apprehended without incident.

Suspects currently in BRPD custody have been identified as the following:

Both have been charged with 11 counts of Accessory After the Fact to Attempted First Degree Murder and Illegal Use of a Weapon.
