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PROFILE

Principal Owner of JRC Development, LLC, a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business. Mastery of technical and tactical skills along with a unique combination of professionalism, leadership, and dignity proven throughout a 37-year career in the US Army, culminating as Adjutant General commanding over 11,000 members of the Louisiana National Guard.

Major General (Retired) Glenn Curtis, owner and manager of JRC Development, has led responses to every major disaster in the Southeastern United States since Hurricane Andrew in 1992, as well as large-scale international missions in Central America, the Caribbean and the Middle East. General Curtis' military career culminated with his appointment by two Louisiana Governors as the Adjutant General of the Louisiana National Guard, where he commanded over 11,000 personnel and led planning, budgeting, and delivery of major critical projects on time and under budget.

General Curtis specializes in large-scale disaster response and recovery events. He leverages relationships fostered over years of disaster recovery to put the right teams together for efficient mission success. Most recently, General Curtis assisted Dynamic Construction Group with award of the contract to build an alternate care site in the New Orleans, Louisiana Morial Convention Center in response to the tremendous COVID-19 forecasts for hospital bed capacity. His team built the first 1,000 patient rooms and 65 nurse stations within 9 days; the facility received its first COVID-positive patients on Day 10. Construction continued within the operational care site, and General Curtis led the team to complete an additional 1,000 rooms. The entire project was completed in just 25 days.

General Curtis has tremendous international disaster response experience. In 2004, he deployed to the Middle East with the US Army and served as the Chief of Staff of the Project and Contracting Office in the effort to rebuild the Republic of Iraq. The PCO team provided project management and construction management for over 2,200 projects, including reconstruction of a hospital, numerous water wells, a 750-person housing unit and a 10-story office building. His team of more than 2,000 personnel consisted of Department of Defense servicemembers from all branches, along with US contractors and civilians, and Iraqi employees. The reconstruction effort totaled \$23.5 billion.

Additionally, General Curtis led the recovery effort in Haiti after the catastrophic 7.0 Mw earthquake struck the Caribbean island in 2010, causing roughly \$8 billion in damage. He quickly deployed the right assets to assist Haitian citizens, rebuild schools, facilities and roads, and bring a sense of normalcy back to the country.
