

Councilwoman Tara Wicker Partners with the East Baton Rouge Sheriff's Community Policing Division for Grocery Distribution

The ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic has involved so many throughout the nation stepping up to ameliorate some of the difficulties that have impacted their local citizens.
